CIL Profits Show Decrease

MONTREAL, (CP) — Canadian Industries Ltd., Wednesday reported a decrease in net profits for the first six months of 1954, prior to the division of its assets and operations between Canadian Industries 1954 Ltd., and Du Pont of Canada Securities Ltd.

The half-year statement showed net profit of \$4,419,526. No figure was listed for the first six months of 1953 but the profit for year was \$10,000,000.

Profit for the first six months of this year was equivalent to 60 cents a share after preferred dividends, compared with a 1953 dividend of \$1.49 for 12 months.

Canadian Industries 1954 Ltd. announced it will ask shareholders to approve proposals to finance expansion plans and repay an \$18,000,000 loan from the controlling shareholder, Imperial Chemical Industries Ltd., of Britain. The shareholders' meeting will be held Oct. 20.

A company statement in August predicted the expenditure of \$60,000,000 in the next three years to finance expansion and improvement.
