Accompanying the pair from Atlantic City was Ron Grude, a director of the world professional swimming federation.

Grude has also been trainer for Willemse at Atlantic City for the last five years.

Owner of a cattle ranch, chicken farm and also a real estate dealer, the Argentine showed fine form while doing his workout yesterday. Prior to jumping into the water to swim alongside Willemse, Carlos, who prefers choppy water, said "I feel good when there's a little wave against me."

Larerra, who is a comeback trail having retired from Marathon swimming in January 1963 and returning in June of this year to compete in the Capri-Naples race after being injured in an expenses paid trip to swim in this marathon. He finished fifth.

"I wasn't in shape for it," Larerra commented, "I had been smoking about 40 cigarettes a day and I had to quit them before I was in any shape to do this."
