Telephone Co. Bill Amended

Second reading was given in the Legislature last night to a private bill that would increase the limit of capital stock of the Island Telephone Company Limited to \$5,000,000 from \$2,000,000.

Promoter of the bill was M. Alban Farmer (PC-Charlottetown). The amended portion of the act to incorporate the company now reads: "the capital stock of the company shall be \$5,000,000 divided into 100,000 shares of \$10 each with power to increase the same from time to time to any amount not exceeding \$5,000,000 by a vote of a majority of shares issued by the company at a special general meeting called for that purpose or at any general meeting of the company."

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New Regional School Planned For Kensington

At a meeting of the board held Tuesday evening with the architect, G. Keith Pickard, plans were completed for a 12-room school which will contain a home economics room, music room, non-profit cafeteria, gymnasium-auditorium, audio-visual room, and chemistry and physics laboratories.

The new school will be located on the outskirts of Kensington on Margate Road. Tenders will be called within three weeks and it is hoped to have the building ready for occupancy for the beginning of the school term in September.

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Three Sugar Refineries Are Charged

MONTREAL (CP) - Three large sugar refineries were formally charged Wednesday with conspiring to restrict trade in eastern Canada between Jan. 1, 1954, and Jan. 20, 1955.

The companies - the Acadia-Atlantic Sugar Refineries Limited, the Canada and Dominion Sugar Company Limited and the St. Lawrence Sugar Refineries Limited - pleaded not guilty through counsel and will face preliminary hearing April 10 in Montreal.

The charges encompass the provinces of Quebec, Ontario, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island.

The prosecutions follow a report given Justice Minister David Fulton by the Restrictive Practices Commission in February, 1960.

The report was made public March 2, 1960, five years after the investigation began under T. D. MacDonald, the department's first investigation director. The summonses were issued last week.
