Cyrus Eaton Company Wins Split Income Tax Decision

OTTAWA (CP) — A company controlled by Cyrus Eaton, Canadian-born American industrialist, has won a split decision in a tax fight with the federal revenue department. A judgment of the income tax appeal board, dated Jan. 12 but issued only Wednesday, did not name the company but from references to Mr. Eaton and to his enterprises it was obviously consolidated Premium Iron Ores Limited. The company won its claim of a deduction from taxable income for payments to Transcontinental Resources Limited, a company which shared in the financing of Steep Rock Iron Mines Limited. Consolidated Premium was set up by Mr. Eaton to finance and market Steep Rock Iron Ore, another Eaton enterprise. TAX PAYMENTS The payments were \$46,532 in 1951 and \$45,192 in 1952—a total of \$91,724 or 20 per cent of Steep Rock reimbursements on financing arrangements made by the appellant company. Consolidated Premium collected these sums from Steep Rock, then remitted them to Transcontinental. However, the company lost a claim for a deduction of \$12,317 in 1951 and \$9,514 in 1952—a total of \$21,831—paid to American lawyers acting for the firm in a tax battle with the U.S. department of international revenue. Consolidated Premium Iron Ores, recognized here as a Canadian company, has been involved in a U.S. tax claim for \$4,600,000 for the period 1943 to 1949. A U.S. tax court freed the company from the tax claim, but the U.S. government has appealed and is awaiting a decision.
