Tremendous U.S. Power Stressed By McNamara

WASHINGTON (AP) — Defense Secretary McNamara said today that the United States has the capability to strike power, and still have enough left over to counter a blackball threat from any third power. This is a point which has long bothered many U.S. strategists, particularly in view of the possibility that Red China will develop atomic weapons in the near future.

Argentina Vote Heavy For Peron

McNamara, in a wide-ranging weekend interview, also said that the United States would be able to meet non-nuclear crises on two fronts simultaneously without resorting immediately to partial mobilization. That is something the country has not been able to do since the Second World War.

Their efforts formed part of a pattern of intricate pressure building up in Geneva and in London, Washington and Moscow on this issue. The United States is reported to have told several delegations here that President Kennedy intends to go ahead with the American testing series in mid-Pacific in late April unless negotiations produce a test-ban treaty with efficient controls before then.
