The Ontario Elections.

OTTAWA, Feb. 28. The Local Elections in Ontario took place yesterday. Returns received so far show that the Government of Mr Mowatt has been sustained, but that the majority in the House has been reduced to a dozen. Mr Mowatt was elected by acclamation in North Oxford. Mr Crooks, Minister of Education, was returned for South Oxford. Mr Hardy was returned in Brant, and Mr Pardee was elected for West Lambton. All the members of the Government were elected. Full returns are not in yet.

NEW YORK, Feb. 28. A despatch received yesterday states that the revolutionists of Ecuador have captured Quito, after severe fighting.

Telegraph Notes.

The Duchess of Albany has been safely delivered of a daughter at Windsor Castle. The Prince of Wales arrived at Berlin, on the 25th inst. He was received at the depot by the Crown Prince Frederick William and family. The Imperial, a Madrid newspaper, publishes a detailed account of the discovery in Andalusia of societies whose aim is to destroy rights of property and exterminate the Bourgeoisie land-owners.

A ukase has been published by the Russian Government appointing a commission to examine and amend the laws relating to Jews, which will afterward be submitted to the legislative department for examination.

The Director says the dissatisfaction existing in Berlin regarding the attitude of the Vatican has been increased on account of the exorbitant claims of the Curia, and that all tends to the belief that negotiations will be suspended. Mr. Gladstone will arrive in London on Thursday. The police, on Saturday, renewed precautions for his safety. It is known that several additional suspected persons arrived in the city last week and important information regarding their movements has been received.
