At the Stipendiary Magistrate's Court this forenoon, John McLeod and Alexander McNichar, were each fined \$1 and costs or 4 days for being drunk and incapable. Judgement in the Butcher assault case will be given on 4th of December.

Word was received yesterday from Point du Chene that a temporary track had been laid to replace that recently destroyed by the storm, and that freight going over the Intercolonial for P. E. Island will now be shipped from here as usual.

Mr. T. L. Chappelle, in consequence of the neatness with which his Almanac was printed by Messrs. Coombs & Worth, entertained the employes of their establishment by an oyster supper at the "North Star" last evening.

PREPARING FOR CHRISTMAS.—Mr. Patrick Gallagher has supplemented his large stock of pork by the purchase of between 600 and 700 sheep, mostly from P. E. I. we believe. Mr. G. is determined to be well provided with mutton for the next few weeks.—*St. John Tel.*

THE proprietor of the *London Figaro* has been sentenced to three months imprisonment and a fine of £100 for publishing articles by Mrs. Weldon on the lunacy laws, in which she stated that her husband and Lieut. Gen. Sir Henry DeBathe had conspired to confine her for interested motives.

NOVA SCOTIAN TROTTERS IN EUROPE.—Mr. J. C. Mahon, of Truro, N. S., who recently took several Nova Scotian trotters to England, has returned. He states that he sold them all at good prices to an agent of the French Government, who commissioned him to buy six trotting mares.

QUICK WORK.—The brig *Deodarus* was loaded with extraordinary despatch at this port. She commenced loading oats on Monday afternoon, and completed her cargo of 23,000 bushels at noon to-day, without night work. The Captain expresses himself, pleased with the facilities for loading grain at this port.

THE RIFLE.—No. 3 Company, Captain Longworth's Company will parade in full uniform to-night, at 7½ o'clock, in the Drill Shed for drill and general inspection. The corps will be exercised in company and battalion drill, and the firing and bayonet exercise. The band of the 82nd battalion will be in attendance.

COUNTRY TRADE.—During the past four days of this week the business men of County Line Station bought and paid for in cash twenty-nine thousand pounds of pork, sixteen hundred lbs choice dairy butter, six hundred pounds poultry, and a large quantity of oats. It is now the general opinion that farmers having produce for this fall's shipment should rally it to market, as the season is fast drawing to a close.

HAPPENY DEFEATED BY HOURIHAN.—A five mile "go-as-you-please" match on the Boston Base-Ball Grounds, on Monday, between Happeny, of Charlottetown, and Hourihan of Boston, was closely contested, Hourihan finishing the distance in 28 minutes 4 seconds. Happeny stopped on the last mile, and both men claimed fouls, but the referee said he had seen no fouling, and thought the best thing he could do was to let the race be run over again.
