OTTAWA (CP)—Health Min-
ister Judy LaMarsh wants her
name spelled that way—me-
dical, capital L, capital M—
even though it hurts.

Historically, she says, her
family's French Huguenot name
is spelled with two words and
capital letters. She used to spell it
herself and on election to Par-
liament in 1960 told The Canadian
Press she preferred that
form.

Now she has changed her
mind. A letter from her to CP
says: "To help avoid any con-
fusion in the future, May I in-
form you that the correct spell-
ing is—LaMarsh."

Why? Miss LaMarsh says that
she is right and she isn't
right. She says she has over
included, and errors in typog-
raphy, her name usually gets
spelled LaMarsh anyway and
she has decided to adopt the
one-word form.

**Communists Like
Canadian Cattle**

OTTAWA (CP)—Communist
countries like Canadian cattle.
The Soviet Union now is
importing more than ever
agriculture department officials
said Thursday.

According to the Soviet
agriculture department officials
said Thursday, \$250,000 worth
has been placed for purebred Al-
berta Herefords by a delega-
tion from the Soviet Union.

Russia bought 200 head worth
\$45,000 in 1960, 362 head in 1961
and 500 head in 1962. Communists
wax has bought sporadically,
Romanians in 1960 bought 1,250
head worth \$201,000.

Last year, Cuba bought about
3,000 head of cattle—aside from
1,500 head of swine and large
amounts of poultry—valued at
just over \$1,000,000.

However, Cuban purchases
have virtually ended.
Canadian officials say Rus-
sians prefer Canadian breeding
stock because Alberta beef cat-
tle are used to living in
sharper than the same climate
conditions as in Russia.

The latest buy order was
submitted by Russia in two
lots in July and August.

From certain countries, in-
dividually Russia has been
working to build up beef and
dairy production.
