Citizenship And Immigration Dept. Official On Visit

The Assistant Atlantic District Superintendent of the Canadian Department of Citizenship and Immigration, Mr. A. G. Christie, whose headquarters are in Halifax has been visiting Charlottetown on a public relations mission.

One of his first calls was made on Premier A. W. Matheson who gave him a cordial welcome. Later he visited the Provincial Department of Agriculture, Mr. Lincoln Dewar, secretary of the P. E. I. Federation of Agriculture; Inspector Nevin, of the R.C.M.P., C. W. McArthur, Chief of Police, Rev. E. C. Evans, past president of the Ministerial Association; Mr. Leonard Goodwin, collector of customs, and representative of the Canadian Immigration Department in the Province; and H. B. Chandler of the National Film Board, and chief librarian Prince of Wales College.

Yesterday afternoon at Red Cross Headquarters on Prince Street Mr. Christie gave an informative talk to the representatives of a number of Charlottetown organizations. Represented at the meeting were the Catholic Women's League, the I.O.D.E., the Canadian Legion, the Canadian Citizenship Council, the Canadian Red Cross, the National Employment Office, the Business and Professional Women's Club and the Queen Mary Needlework Guild.

This morning Mr. Christie will leave for Summerside visiting the Rev. Father Simpson of Saint Dunstan's University en route. Father Simpson is in charge of agricultural activities at the University and has been in touch with a number of the immigrants who have come to the island in recent years. Although pressed for time, Mr. Christie will make as many visits as possible in Summerside before returning to Halifax.

Accompanying the official has been Mr. Vince F. Chisholm of Halifax who carries out field work for the Citizenship and Immigration Department. The island is included in Mr. Chisholm's territory and he usually arrives in the Province once a month on business. His

present visit is routine. Mr. A. G. Christie is well known in this city and Province, where he has numerous friends and also family ties through marriage. Concluding his activities yesterday he expressed his appreciation of the work done by fraternal and service organizations in the city on behalf of new Canadians.

George Drew Leaves Hospital

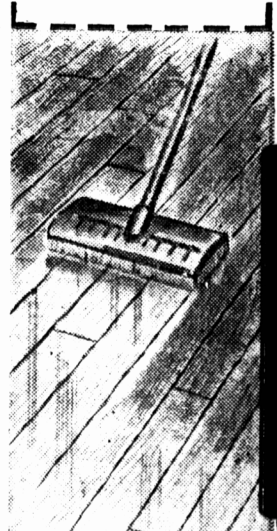
