MONTREAL (CP) - Prices on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges Friday showed higher in heavy closing trading.
The local market moved slowly until the afternoon, when papers and base metals sparked a sudden upturn.
International Nickel was the only weak spot in metals. It lost two points at 105. Aluminum gained a point at 45 1/2 and Tauracanis scored a gain of 3/4. Smelters gained 3/4 at 24 and Hudson Bay, which rose 3/4 Thursday, climbed a further 1/4, stopping at 69 1/2.

GRAIN

WINNEPEG (CP) - Fairly active trade developed Friday on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange and prices generally were steady.
Barley uncovered some shippers and export demand. Covering orders also appeared. Trade reports indicated parcel lots of barley were sold to the United Kingdom.
There was no overseas business in fax reports. American houses were on both sides of the market in rye.
Overnight export loadings of Canadian wheat totalled 1,145,000 bushels, including: Switzerland 145,000, United Kingdom 630,000, and France 370,000.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market paused for breath Friday, dipping mildly, after its run in successive sessions to three straight highs for 1957.
Wall Street analysts ascribed the decline to profit-taking combined with the normal pre-weekend caution. They noted that oil prices tapered-off substantially as prices softened, always an indication that the underlying trend is bullish.

IN MEMORIAM

ROBERT R. WEBSTER
Residents of Midgell and surrounding communities were saddened when they learned that Robert R. Webster had passed away on November 26, 1956 in her 92nd year.
Although in failing health for some time and confined to his home for two years, his keen intellect and memory, and interest in local as well as world wide events never failed until the time of his death.
He was born at Marie, the son of Edward and Henrietta (Bowley) Webster and great-grandson of the first John Webster who came to Prince Edward Island from England about the year 1760.
For many years he operated a flour and saw mill and in later years moved to Midgell where he spent his remaining years.

WINTERS WILL LEAVE POLITICS

HALIFAX (CP) - Robert H. Winters, defeated Liberal minister of public works, said Monday night he feels it is time for him to retire from public life.
"This is probably my last opportunity to serve the people of Nova Scotia in the field of public affairs," he said. "I think it is time to retire to private enterprise in one form or another."
Mr. Winters, 46, was defeated in Queens-Lunenburg by Progressive Conservative Lloyd R. Crouse, one of 10 PCs elected to Nova Scotia's 12 Commons seats.
