BURSARY DEADLINES

Pillsbury Undergraduate Scholarship Program

Four awards equally valued at \$1,250 will be awarded to students in the following programs: two awards for Business/Commerce; one award for Food Science; one award for Agricultural Science. Applicants must have completed two full years of study. Evaluators will be based on student's academic ability, as well as participation in extra-curricular activities. Applications are available from Student Services.

DEADLINE: November 30

Terry Fox Humanitarian Award Program

These awards valued at \$3,000 per year/renewable until first degree, are open to students working towards a first degree. Candidates are primarily judged on the extent to which they demonstrate the highest ideals and qualities of citizenship and humanitarian service while in pursuit of excellence in their academic, amateur sport, fit-

ness, health, and voluntary service endeavours. This award is based on merit. Academic record, need, and athletic ability are not of major importance. Anyone interested in applying may pick up an application from Student Services. Applicants must have the form returned to Student Services by January 12 for final consideration by the Nominating Committee.

REPORT OF THE TREASURER

The audit for the academic year 1985-86 has been completed by Doane Raymond, and outlines that the records of the Student Union were presented fairly.

The budget for the academic year 1986-87 has been completed and so far we estimate revenues of \$272,490.00 and total expenditures of \$267,413.44 to come up with the cash at the end of the budgeted year of \$5076.56. Baha'i Studies Prerequisite for Peace

Before peace comes without, in the of men's joint life on this planet, a of it must first come within. How can we enforce new laws, support far-reaching international policies, drive forward untied towards our goal of world cooperation and coordination, freedom of fear, unless we ourselves each set our own compass on something firm to steer by and seek to know what is a human being's real place in the scheme of things? What are his potentialities? What is required of him? And let each one ask himself, what can I do myself?

Over a century ago, Baha'u'llah stated that "the well-being of mankind, its peace and security are unattainable unless and until its unity is firmly established." The call of Baha'u'llah for the unity of mankind also has its counterpart at the individual level. On the personal level, we are likewise challenged with the task of attaining a state of unity, not only the inner unity necessary of creating a full and integrated life for ourselves, but also a interpersonal unity, a unity between ourselves and the members of our family, society, country, and the world. This is a call for a condition of unity which will ultimately encompass the whole earth.

To achieve this high level of individual and collective unity, we require a new mind-self, new approaches to the use of power and love in our relationships, a new perspective on freedom, justice, and equality, a new understanding of the roles of religion and science in

human affairs, and a new approach to the issues of the equality of men and women, among others. The accomplishment of world peace, as Baha'u'llah attests, is possible only if we are willing to humble ourselves and approach this task with a spirit of humanity and receptivity. Baha'u'llah said:

"O contending peoples and kindreds of the earth! Set your faces towards unity, and let the radiance of its lights shine upon you. Gather ye together, and for the sake of God resolve to root out whatever is the source of contention amongst you. Then will the effulgence of the world's Luminary envelop the whole earth, and its inhabitants become the citizens of one city, the occupants of one and the same throne."

When we speak about unity, it does not imply that all people should behave in a specific way, or dress the same or have the same culture. Rather, it is the coming together of all different cultures and peoples of the world, because each culture has its own beauty and vitality which it can contribute to the whole. And when all peoples of the earth come to the realization of world unity, this globe will be another world.
