Irving and Robert Brydges, are worthy of special mention, and there can be no doubt that had they not at the critical moment stood firmly by their post the fire would have spread indefinitely. The Hook and Ladder Company under the command of Mr. James Butcher, did good service. Owing to the bursting of the leather hose, the Steam Fire Engine did not do their work so promptly as usual. Our citizens had nevertheless a very good illustration of the economy of laying out money to advantage; and they might take a practical hint respecting the expediency of introducing a plentiful supply of water. We regret to learn that one poor fellow—named Morton—had, his arm broken, and several persons were badly burned. The clothes of some of the firemen were spoiled. We understand that the firemen are not provided with clothes; and we suggest that in cases where a garment belonging to any fireman is destroyed at a fire it should be replaced at the cost of the city.

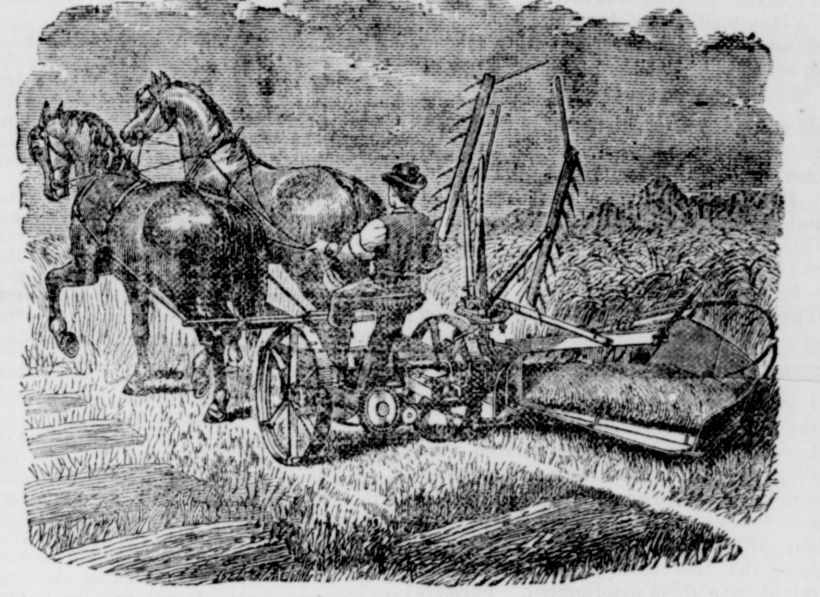
