Reports Red Cross Drive Making Good Progress

A very gratifying report on the progress of the 1955 campaign was given yesterday afternoon by Mr. Walter R. Shaw at the regular monthly meeting of the executive, P. E. I. Division, Canadian Red Cross Society. The statement presented by Mr. Shaw revealed that 75 per cent of the provincial objective has now been reached with \$20,910.53 received, \$9,970.91 of this amount has been subscribed in Charlottetown with a considerable number of canvassers still to report; \$2,600 in Summerside with still many collectors to make returns; \$2,150.87 from some 60 of the 163 districts in Prince County; \$3,751.36 from 94 of the 174 districts in Queens; and \$2,144.77 from 55 of the 135 districts in Kings County.

Excelsior reports were heard from the chairmen of all standing committees outstanding a month which was that of Disaster Services given by Mr. J. Gordon MacDonald who stated that in the past three months calls had been answered with regard to 13 fires involving 14 families consisting of 61 individuals for whom different emergency services were rendered. Some 152 articles of bedding and clothing were provided by Red Cross through the Women's Work Committee and purchases. In addition many other items were provided by church organizations and Women's Institutes and others whose efforts were coordinated. Mr. MacDonald in his report paid tribute to all who are co-operating so magnificently in setting up different Disaster Committees in various centres throughout the province, and particularly to the Amateur Radio Operators of the Keith Rogers Memorial Radio Club who have set up an emergency station at Red Cross headquarters at their own expense in order to provide additional communication lines in the event of an emergency.
