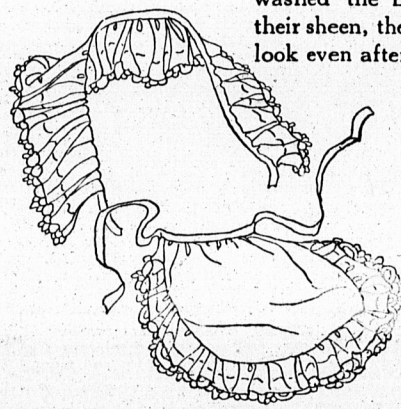

Islander Dies in Kansas

The following in Memoriam is taken from a Kansas exchange:—At his home in Rock, Kansas, U. S., on March 5th, 1922, Daniel D. MacDougall answered his final call to the great beyond.

He was the youngest son of the late Dougall MacDougall, and was born March 22nd, 1866, at Canoe Cove, P.E.I.

He received his education in the schools of this Province, and at an early age began his profession as a teacher. His first charges were the schools of Malpeque, New Argyle, and Canoe Cove. In 1884, heeding the call to the west, he came to Butler County, Kansas, where his efforts were crowned with success. Stirred on by great ambition he further pursued his studies in the higher educational institutions of the state of Kansas.

While teaching in Butler County, he met and won his bride, Miss Ella Varner. Their marriage took place at De Graff. On May 4th, 1890 they moved to Rock, where they resided till his death on March 5th.

As an infant our brother was dedicated to God in Baptism. With a Rock as Sabbath School Supt. and Gospel Team leader, he used his talents to the glory of God. His Christian fortitude and patience were evident during the last month of his illness. Often he voiced his testimony: "Here we have no abiding city but we seek one to come." Even to the closing days of his life the sacred songs sung in his home stirred his soul. Brother MacDougall was a member of Douglas Lodge, No. 151 A. F. and A. M. He was made a Mason in 1915.

Those left to cherish his memory, are his faithful wife, and adopted children, Harry Stone, of Douglas and Raymond Gray, of Rock and on P.E. Island two brothers, Collin and New Argyle; Dougall on the old home at Canoe Cove. One sister Mrs. David Iman, also of Canoe Cove, and a sister-in-law, Mrs. Mary D. MacDougall, 321 Fitzroy St., Charlottetown. Both at home and abroad are many relatives and friends who mourn the death of a beloved brother and respected citizen.

The funeral services were held at Rock, M. E. Church, conducted by Rev. R. L. Wells. Interment at Augustus, Mausoleum, being in charge of Douglas Lodge, A. F. and A. M.

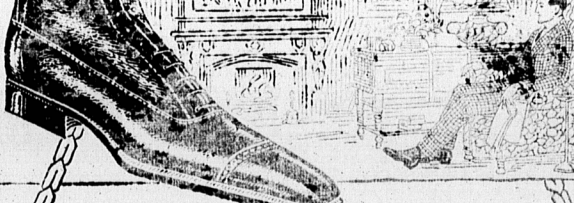
