

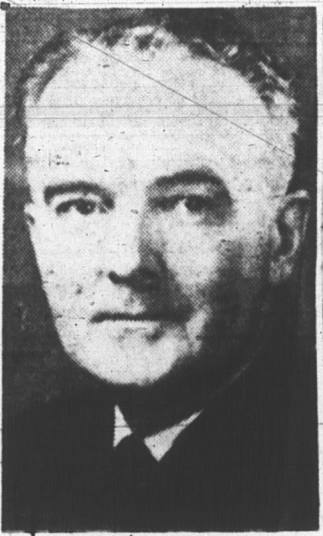

Gulf Gunn Steel Trawler Performs Well In Trials

GEORGETOWN - The 128 foot steel trawler, the Gulf Gunn, built at Georgetown by Bathurst Marine Limited left her building yard yesterday afternoon for sea trials on the Gulf of St. Lawrence off Georgetown Harbor and returned to port at 4:30 p.m.

The Gulf Gunn was christened on December 23 last by Mrs. Jens Moe and launched the same day. The ship is reported to have handled beautifully on her trial run and has a speed of 11.6 knots. Her net registered tonnage is 243.84 tons and her gross tonnage is 503.85 tons. She draws 7 feet 6 inches of water forward and 14 feet 1 inch aft. The ship is powered by a Normo Diesel 780 horse power motor.

When engaged in fishing she will have a crew of 17 and will carry 1600 to 1800 aluminum boxes to hold the cargo of fish.

MODERN AIDS: She is equipped with all the modern navigational aids and her electronic equipment includes radio telephones, navigational instruments and echo sounders used to locate schools of fish. Her fish carrying capacity is approximately double that of the 94 foot trawlers formerly constructed by Bathurst Marine Limited.

Her sister ship, the Gulf Grenadier, fishing since May, have brought huge loads of fish to
