

### Increase Pay In The U. N. Force

OTTAWA (CP)—A pay raise of about 82 cents a day has been given to Canadian and other members of the United Nations Emergency Force in Egypt.

Army headquarters here said the money—a UN overseas service allowance—is 30 Egyptian piastres a day, retroactive to Dec. 17. It is the same for all ranks of all nations.

Canadian army foreign allowance ranges from \$9 a month for privates to \$16.50 for warrant officers, class one, with higher rates for officers. Both the Canadian and UN allowances are over and above normal pay and allowances.

## New Prison Techniques Try To Turn Juveniles From Crime

ASHLAND, Ky. (AP)—A pretty taffy-haired coed at Ashland Junior College found herself stealing glances at a strangely aloof freshman.

Other students called him Dan. When they met, Dan spoke politely but never tried to date her. It piques her vanity. Finally, she asked him to a dance.

"I'm sorry," he apologized, "I can't."

Pressed for an explanation, Dan told her: "You know that federal prison out on the edge of town. I live there. I'm a prisoner."

His story was true. Dan K-19, had held up a bank at gunpoint and escaped with \$18,000. It was his first offence and he was serving the last few months of a two-year sentence at the federal correctional institution at Ashland—and attending the local junior college by day. The prison mail truck dropped him at the campus in the morning. At night, it brought him back to prison.

**NEW TREATMENT**

Although far from typical, the story of Dan K-19 illustrates a new and revolutionary trend in the treatment of young lawbreakers committed to prison under the 1950 Federal Youth Corrections Act.

Basically, the program is designed to separate youngsters from hardened criminals—and to prove that juvenile delinquency needn't lead inevitably to an adult career in crime.

Strange things are happening. On a visit to Ashland, I watched a prison psychiatrist inject inmates with "truth serum"—not to force a confession but to break down psychic barriers and probe deep behind the tough, embittered front of a frightened boy.

Investigation disclosed that federal prison authorities also have recently begun using electro-encephalogram (brain wave) machines and "tranquility" drugs in bold new experiments to find out what makes young criminals tick.

Two hundred miles eastward, at Natural Bridge, Va., nestled in a snug valley between pine-studded peaks of the Blue Ridge Mountains, I found a 15-acre prison without walls or bars. It has no cells, no locks, no armed guards, not even a fence or a sign to brand it as a prison.

The sign at the entrance merely says: Natural Bridge Boys Camp. SALVATION IN WORK. Camp director Wilson McGowan,
