which was ruffed. A club to dummy's queen lost to the king and the contract was defeated. Actually, the contract is unbeatable all the way. No distribution of the adverse cards can be arranged to stop declarer from making four hearts. A few proper preliminary steps will assure the contract. The first of these is to play a low spade from dummy on the opening lead, and win with the ace. A trump is then led to dummy's queen and a diamond is ruffed. Another trump to dummy is followed by another diamond ruff. The stage is now set. Dummy has no more diamonds; the defenders have no more trumps. A low club is led and dummy's nine is played. East wins but has no exit card which will not cost him a trick. A spade play makes dummy's queen a trick; a club play is into dummy's A-Q; a diamond return gives declarer a ruff and a discard. The key play is the low spade from dummy on the opening lead. Declarer notes there are four possible losers—two spades and two clubs. If West has either the king of spades or king of clubs the contract is unbeatable. The assumption is therefore made that East has both of them and steps are taken to provide for this contingency. These steps include removing dummy's diamond. Once this is done the endplay position that results assures fulfillment of the contract.
