

### Some Similarities Are Noted Munsinger-Profumo Probes

OTTAWA (CP)—The inquiry by Mr. Justice Wishart Spence into the Gerda Munsinger affair has some similarities to the 1963 inquiry in Britain by Lord Denning into the Profumo affair.

The full pattern of Mr. Justice Spence's inquiry has not yet emerged. He and commission officers have consulted Lord Denning's report and examined his methods of proceeding. While the two inquiries are similar in investigatin situations in which the words sex and security have been attached, the Spence inquiry differs in some important ways from Lord Denning's investigation.

The main difference is that the Canadian Supreme Court judge was appointed by the Liberal cabinet to inquire into allegations involving sex and security with respect to former ministers of a Conservative government out of office three years.

When Lord Denning undertook his inquiry, it was at the request of then prime minister MacMillan who two weeks earlier had accepted the resignation of his own war minister, John Profumo. Profumo re-

signed as minister, and later as a member of Parliament, for having lied to Parliament about Christine Keeler.

The two inquiries differ also in that Lord Denning received evidence not given under oath. So far, Mr. Justice Spence in one secret session of his inquiry has received some evidence under oath.

**VERACITY UNAFFECTED**  
In his report, Lord Denning commented on this point: "I have been told as much truth without an oath as if I were on oath."

This appears to be part of the less formal approach to the inquiry adopted in Britain.

Lord Denning undertook his investigation on the informal request of prime minister MacMillan. Mr. Justice Spence was appointed under the Inquiries Act with formal terms of reference drawn up by the Liberal cabinet which the Conservatives protested were inadequate.

A central element of the Denning inquiry was that Profumo and a Russian intelligence officer, Captain Eugene Ivanov, shared Christine Keeler's favors.

In the Munsinger affair, the spy angle arose from allegations of Justice Minister Cardin

that two or more Conservative cabinet ministers were involved with the 36-year-old German blonde whom he described as having been engaged in espionage work before her arrival in Canada in 1955.

Among the similarities is the secrecy surrounding both inquiries. All of Lord Denning's work was done behind closed doors with press and public excluded. Mr. Justice Spence's opening session was held in secret and he has not yet said definitely whether any of his hearings will be open.

No lawyers for Profumo or others involved in the Denning inquiry were permitted to attend the inquiry hearings. The same was true of the initial hearing of the Spence inquiry. However, the Canadian judge has indicated to some potential witnesses that they will be permitted counsel at some of the future hearings.

(Mr. Justice Spence announced Wednesday that counsel for interested persons will be present at future commission sessions and will be able to question witnesses.) Lord Denning and Mr. Justice Spence examined published articles during their inquiries. The former studied articles in British and foreign publications, including some signed by Christine Keeler.

Informants say Mr. Justice Spence's inquiry officers have assembled at least two articles which appeared in publications under the name of Gerda Munsinger.

In both inquiries, police officers and security officials appeared to tell about their operations and investigations.

**CHECK ON SECURITY**  
In each case, the object of this information was to help the presiding officer decide what was known to the police, security officers and cabinet ministers and whether a security risk was involved.

Mr. Cardin in his allegations said there was a security risk and that Opposition Leader Dielenbaker, prime minister at the time, mishandled the case by not referring it to the justice department's legal officers for an opinion.

Lord Denning's report supplied his definition of a security risk: "In my opinion immorality or

discreditable conduct is only a security risk if it is committed in such circumstances that it might expose the person concerned to blackmail or to undue pressures which might lead him to give away secret information."

He also says in amplification: "In short, every case of immorality or discreditable conduct must depend on its own special circumstances, and not least on the length of time past since it happened and the likelihood of undue pressure being exerted."
