

Summer Arrangements for Travel.

Trains leave Charlottetown for the West at 6 a. m., 8.45 a. m., and 3.30 p. m., (standard time) daily.

Trains leave Charlottetown for Georgetown and Souris at 6.30 a. m. and 3.15 p. m. (standard time) daily.

Trains leave Charlottetown for the East at 6 a. m. and 1.10 p. m. (standard time) daily.

Trains leave Georgetown for the West at 7 a. m. and 2.40 p. m. (standard time) daily.

Trains leave Souris for the West at 6.15 a. m. and 1.20 p. m. (standard time) daily.

One of the P. E. Island Steam Navigation Company's steamers plies daily between Summerside and Point du Chene, leaving Summerside at or about 9 o'clock (local time).

(local time), calling at Westville and Rocky Point. The same steamer leaves Charlottetown for Rocky Point on Tuesdays and Fridays, at 9.30 a. m. and 2 p. m. (local time), and on Wednesdays and Saturdays at 8.30 a. m., and 9.30 a. m., and at 2 and 4 p. m. (local time). On Sunday the steamer leaves Charlottetown for Rocky Point at 9 a. m., and 4 p. m.; returning will leave Rocky Point for Charlottetown at 9.30 a. m., and 1.30 p. m.

Sunday.—Leave Rocky Point for Charlottetown, at 3.30 p. m.; Leave Charlottetown for Rocky Point at 4.30 p. m.
