At 11 a. m. morning worship was conducted and the sermon preached by the minister, Rev. A. R. Wallis, B.A. Music was by the church choir under direction of Mr. C. R. Leard with Miss Annie Leard as organist. The anthem was "Church of God, Arise."

Taking his text from the eleventh chapter of the Epistle to the Hebrews, that great roll call of the faithful, Rev.
