Humidity Stirs Late Blight

The lack of rain and the low humidity continued to arrest the progress of potato late blight reports Weekly Potato Bulletin no. 11. This period of low disease activity ended early Monday morning and the fungus began to reproduce itself at a rapid rate. The growers are advised that September is commonly the month of greatest damage from late blight disease and spraying or dusting becomes of increasing importance until the plants are ready to be top-killed.
