### LORD ROSEBERY

ON SPELLING

HAWICK, Scotland, September 19.—Lord Rosebery, speaking at the jubilee dinner last night of the Hawick Arch Geological Society, of which Dr. Murray, editor of the Oxford New English Dictionary, is president, said amidst laughter that he came especially to hear Dr. Murray's opinion of President Roosevelt's spelling reform order and was disappointed that not a word had been uttered on the subject.

Lord Rosebery humorously referred to Mr. Roosevelt's spelling reform, saying a blow struck at the recognized rules of spelling of the English race was a blow at morality itself. Conscientious and virtuous people, he said, were hampered by spelling, but the unscrupulous and vicious rules of their own, producing results fully acceptable to themselves, and sometimes understood by others.

He was not at all sure that the Archæ rules of spelling laid down by tradition and stereotyped by the dictionaries, had not filled half the lunatic asylums of the country. The conscientious man got muddled, but the unscrupulous went ahead, and at the last moment of his life might be honored by the homage of the president of the United States.
