## How Stock Quotations Reach The Canadian Investing Public

TORONTO (CP) - The girls have a lot to remember and a lot to do in a hurry.

They add and subtract round figures and fractions. They study the ticker tape an check columns of figures to see whether a change in one figure requires a change in another. They erase superseded figures and jot down new ones. Upon their work depends the accuracy of the stock market quotations that appear edition by edition in newspapers across Canada.

**BUSY RECORDING STAFF**  
These 17 young women are the recording staff of the Toronto Stock Exchange statistical department.

Let's see just how stock quotations reach a Canadian newspaper.

First, there is the noisy trading floor. Thousands of times daily broker representatives arrive at mutually acceptable prices, and sales and purchases of stock are made.

Each transaction is written on a multi-copy form. One copy goes by pneumatic tube to another room. One of three teletype operators "punches" the transaction into a telegraph code through perforations on a tape.

The tape goes through one of three transmitters and the quotation appears on stock tickers in hundreds of brokers' offices across Canada - and in the exchange's statistical department.

This department is in a long room with rows of high slant-topped tables - much like old - time bookkeepers' desks - with a total length of about 100 feet. Along this length are the names of the more than 1,100 stocks listed on the exchange, each name heading a vertical column about an inch and a quarter wide.

**SELECTIVE TICKERS**  
At intervals along the benches are exchange tickers - as many as 14 in a busy market. Each ticker records only the group of stocks assigned to it. Thus one may record stock names starting A to C; the next D to F, and so on. Each handles only as many stocks as

## Just Walked Out Of Commission

FREDERICKTON (CP) - C. Hedley Forbes, vice-chairman of the New Brunswick Electric Power Commission since shortly after the provincial government took office in 1952, has left the position.

Hon. Edgar Fournier, commission chairman, Wednesday declined to comment on Mr. Forbes' move. The vice-chairmanship has been the chief administrative post.

Mr. Forbes said that any further statement would, he presumed, have to come from the government, but that he did not resign his position. He had "just walked out after a disagreement on policy."

Earlier this week the commission announced the retirement of J. L. Feeny, chief engineer, and the appointment of R. E. Tweedale, manager of operations for the commission, to succeed him. Mr. Feeny has reached retirement age.
