Dear Editor:

A Red Cross Blood Donor Clinic was held at the UPEI Gym on Feb. 5 and 6. The objective for the clinic was 360 pints. I don't believe this is very much to ask from 1586 fulltime students, several hundred parttime students and faculty and staff. Apparently, it was too much to ask as only 214 pints of blood were collected.

The turnout of faculty and staff was very poor, in fact down right disgraceful. Only about 19 showed up, most of whom were staff members.

There were three competitions held in conjunction with this clinic: inter-residence-won by Memorial Hall, interclass-won by the Seniors, and interdepartment-won by the Biology Dept. The Biology Dept. issued a challenge to all the other departments, however, only the Home Economics Dept. accepted this challenge.

ELECTIONS

Nominations opened Mon. Feb. 12, for Student Council positions. The nominations will close Tues. Feb. 20th at 5pm.

Under the new constitution, which was ratified by a general meeting of the Student Body on Feb. 11, 1973, the following positions will be open to contestation: President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Comptroller, Communications Officer, 5 Arts Representatives, 3 Science Representatives, and 1 Education Representative.

The Faculty representation is determined by the enrollment figures in each faculty so that each faculty is represented according to the number of students registered. This is based on having 9 faculty representatives.

Three Senate Members will also be elected, the term of office for two members will be from March 1st, 1973 to Feb. 27, 1974. The third position is to fill the vacancy created by Roger Green who has left the university. This will be in effect until Sept. 1973 when two new members will be elected to the Senate. These Senate members will also sit on Council as voting members.
