The following figures are taken from the Tax Rolls, covering the assessment of one Farm Property:
1949 tax \$ 5.00 including poll tax
1950 tax 34.68 including poll tax
1951 tax 50.88 including poll tax
or an increase of 1017%

You stated that the Quonset Barn at Falconwood did not cost \$17,000, but \$6,800.

The Patriot of March 9th, 1951 quotes the Premier as stating in the Legislature:

March 9, 1950. Question by R. R. Bell to the Provincial Treasurer:
As of February 28th, 1950 what was the total funded and unfunded debt of the Province?

Dr. MacMillan was neither Chairman or member of any Committee advising such tax at any time

Mr. Darby stated that the Conservatives claim in their Platform they received \$7,500,000 from Ottawa, which he denies and alleges to disprove.

The Plank referred to says nothing of the kind. The Conservatives, in 1912, 1926, and 1934 secured JUDGMENTS against Ottawa to that amount, upon which we receive interest at 5% per annum, or \$375,000 annually.
