A sympathetic affliction — far from rare particularly among twins — was disclosed in Toronto involving twin brothers, Bruce and Bob Higgins, seen above with brother John and mother. Two weeks after birth of boys, Robert lost two of his toes as result of burns received while in hospital incubator. Following amputation, parents noted that Bruce's right leg failed to grow as much as his left. One doctor has stated the power of suggestion is responsible for trouble. "When Bruce became aware of the injury to Robert, he subconsciously compensated for his twin's hurt by cutting down on the use of his right limb."
