## Let's Talk It Over

The longer the Korean War drags on the more truth seems to lie in General MacArthur's statement: "There is no substitute for victory." There is no event in history quite like the half-war that is being waged on that far eastern peninsula. It is like two heavy-weight boxers sparring, and each afraid to land a solid blow for fear of infuriating his opponent. Half-wars may be the order of the second half of the twentieth century, now that we have such destructive bombs as to make all-out war too terrible to risk.

The young Progressive Conservatives have made a very wise stand in declaring their intentions to keep away from all forms of bribery in future elections. This movement, started here in recent years by the raising of a very few voices against these practices, seems to be snowballing along, getting more and more converts as the months go by.

Is there not a law against bribery in elections, and could not a party which zealously keeps its own record clean, evoke that law to unseat members of another party if evidence were produced proving corruption? We have the impression that this business has been carried on very openly, and that evidence should not be difficult to obtain.
