A 20-FOOT HIGH STATUE, ERECTED ABOUT 338 B.C. WAS BLOWN UP BY THREASIAN HUNTERS IN 1800 AND ITS FRAGMENTS LAY BURIED IN THE GROUND FOR 100 YEARS. OTTAWA (CP)—Two MPs of different political persuasions agreed Tuesday that the white man is suspect in Indian eyes but they used the contention to point up opposing viewpoints on the question of enfranchising Indians. The measure of agreement was reached between Frank Howard (CPC—Skeena), who has campaigned in the Commons for the last three sessions for the enfranchisement of Indians, and George C. Fairfield (PC—Portage-Neepawa), physician and surgeon whose medical practice includes Indians of two reservations within his constituency.
