NEAR REVOLT BY QUEBEC PC'S BELIEVED TO HAVE SUBSIDED

OTTAWA (CP) - An incident that has been described as a near revolt by Quebec members of the Conservative party in the Commons against the rest of their party apparently has subsided. Observers attribute the fact that no open breach occurred between the Quebecers and the party's Ontario and western-oriented majority to the patient loyalty and care of Leon Balcer, (PC - Trois-Rivieres), the leader of their group. But Mr. Balcer—who has had a telling experience in the ups and downs of personal fortunes in a political party—now has difficult problems of his own to deal with.

palm, said he could only count 500 Greek Cypriots who had been evacuated.
The UN command reported a Greek - Cypriot arms buildup near Famlos, key spot on the supply route to Turkish hill St. Hilarion Castle.
A government statement said the Turkish air attack Saturday killed 33 Greek - Cypriots, 16 men and 17 women, and hit government patrol boat in Keros harbor.
One Turkish Cypriot jet fighter was shot down and the pilot captured after parachuting to earth.
In Moscow, the Communist party newspaper Pravda Sunday accused Turkey of "open aggression" and of floating internationalist slanders against Cyprus. It called for an immediate end to the aggression.
The UN spokesman said 300 women and children were still in Kokkina and had refused to be evacuated by the UN.
Refugees from other Turkish-Cypriot villages were taken to the 8 x 8 km. Sargent camp at Kato Pyrgos and from there to the 1000-man Turkish Cypriot town. Nearly 300 refugees were still at the camp Sunday morning.
The Turkish aircraft were reported to have carried out air strikes against positions south of the Greek-Cypriot area where Turkish Cypriots have control of the only major road to the northwest corner of the island.
A Cyprus government spokesman said the Polis, Limasol, Paphos and Ayios Theodoros areas also were attacked by Turkish jets.
He said a Turkish destroyer also bombarded the whole area "everything except Turkish-Cypriot" - along the northwest coast.
SUPPLIES SOUGHT
"We have asked for UN assistance for food supplies and to help us in removing all those allied, wounded and still alive people before they are burned."
The Greek - Cypriot spokesman said after the jet attacks on the villages the Turkish Cypriots opened fire with mortars, 40 mm and 81 mm "heavy weapons." Then as the land battle progressed, he said, the Turkish jets pounded the Kokkina area.
The Greek - Cypriots also claimed a Turkish invasion fleet had drawn within 10 miles of the Cypriot coast and get it fast - during dawn darkness but then steamed away. The Turks decried they dispatched an invasion fleet.
UN headquarters in Nicotia, meanwhile, reported scattered outbreaks of shooting elsewhere on the island.

Subsequently, when Mr. Dieb's shock formed his first cabinet, Mr. Balcer was given the least onerous of duties as solicitor-general.
