Major Change Is Coming For Eastern Mail Service

Twice-a-day mail service for postal areas located between Charlottetown and Souris is to undergo a major change effective August 1. On that date the present service supplied by the Island Motor Transport will be superseded by a two-way evening service provided by a private carrier. George J. Tule of Charlottetown has been awarded the contract to carry out this work. This new service will leave the City daily at 4:00 p.m., except Sundays, arriving at Souris each evening at 5:45 p.m. On return the new schedule calls for the service to leave Souris at 8:15 p.m., arriving back in Charlottetown at 7:50. On the outgoing trip of this new service the Main Post Office in Charlottetown will dispatch mails to all Post Offices located

in this section of the Province. On the return trip all Post Offices except Bear River, Armadale, Tracadie Cross, Bedford, and Little York, will forward mails to Charlottetown. Mail originating in the above-noted Post Offices, all of which are located at some distance from the highway, will be despatched to the Main Post Office via the outgoing trip. East Baltic and Elmira Post Offices will despatch daily to Souris and also to Charlottetown via Elmira and Souris East. Local letters will be exchanged by means of Mail Wallets to be carried by the contractor, P. E. Ketchum, Saint John, N.B., district director of postal services, who made the announcement of the new arrangements, emphasized that the morning motor vehicle service will continue as at present.

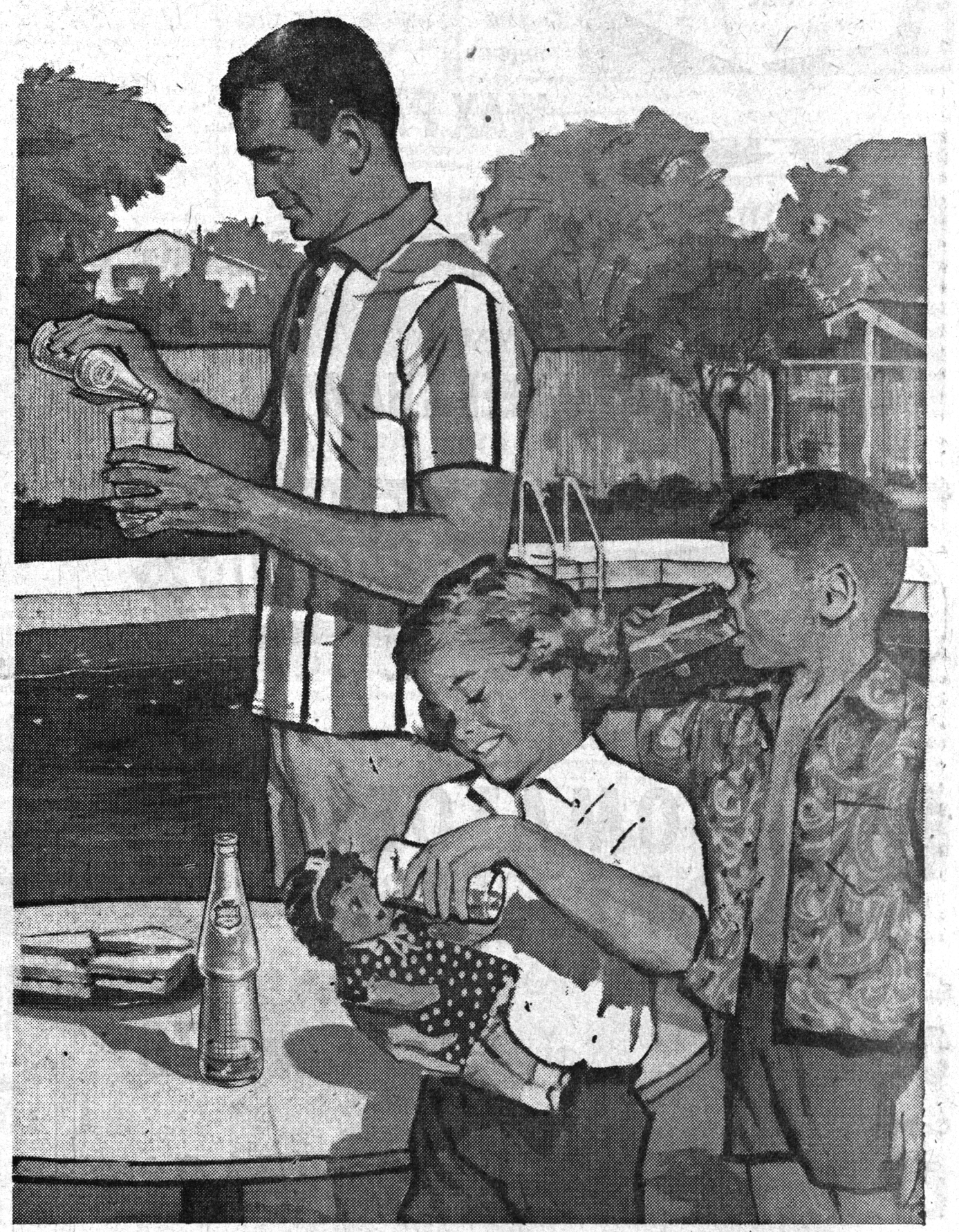
