The annual convention of the Prince Edward Island Teachers' Federation is scheduled to be held in Birchwood High School auditorium April 13-15.

The convention will open after registration with greetings from the City of Charlottetown by Mayor Walter Cox followed by an address by President J. Weeks Murphy. Shortly before Wednesday noon delegates will hear an address by Hon. L. George Dewar, M.D., minister of education.

RING WORM SPREADS
WHITBY, Ont. (CP) — The Kathleen Power public school here has been hit by an outbreak of highly contagious scalp ring worm at a time when the town has no public health nurses to deal with it. About 10 children have been affected so far. Eleven of Ontario County's public health nurses were fired last week after a salary dispute. The Registered Nurses Association of Ontario has advised its members against taking jobs with Ontario County, and the county health unit has only been able to hire one new nurse.
