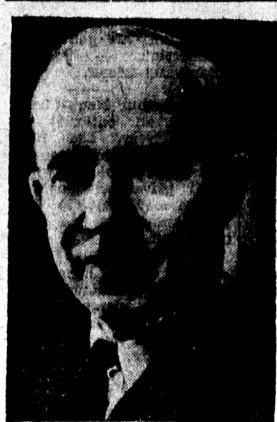


Replies To Critics Of Post Office Services

TORONTO, July 25—Improvements in Canada's postal service "to revolutionary as to be almost of the Jules Verne variety" were forecast today by Walter J. Turnbull, Deputy Postmaster General...

Much Red Tape

Mr. Turnbull told his audience of business men that the Post Office, although forced to adjust itself to varying conditions from coast to coast, "had yet to contend with more controls and red tape than the business man ever thought of in his wildest dreams."

"Tied in with the question of progress and better service is economy of operation," Mr. Turnbull said. He pointed out, as examples of the Post Office Department's constant efforts to save, that changes in the method of handling money orders had saved \$350,000 a year...

Work To Start On Pipeline

LETHBRIDGE, Alta., July 24—(CP) — Work will start tomorrow on the first major pipeline to carry natural gas outside of Alberta. The 56-mile pipeline, authorized last April by the Alberta Legislature as a "defence production emergency to be built by the Canada-Montana Pipeline Company to carry natural gas from the southeastern Alberta Kakowik area to the Anaconda Copper Mining Company's plants at Butte, Montana.

Murder Trial Of N.B. Soldier

WAINWRIGHT, Alta., July 24—(CP) — A crown witness testified today that Pte. H. B. McEachern of Woodstock, N. B., mortally wounded by a rifle shot at the nearby Wainwright Military Camp, named Pte. Frederick J. Sabatilis as the man who shot him. McEachern died a few minutes later. The witness was Lance Corporal A. H. Empey. He testified at the preliminary hearing of Sabatilis who is charged with the slaying of McEachern here June 30. Sabatilis is from Kingsclear, N. B.
