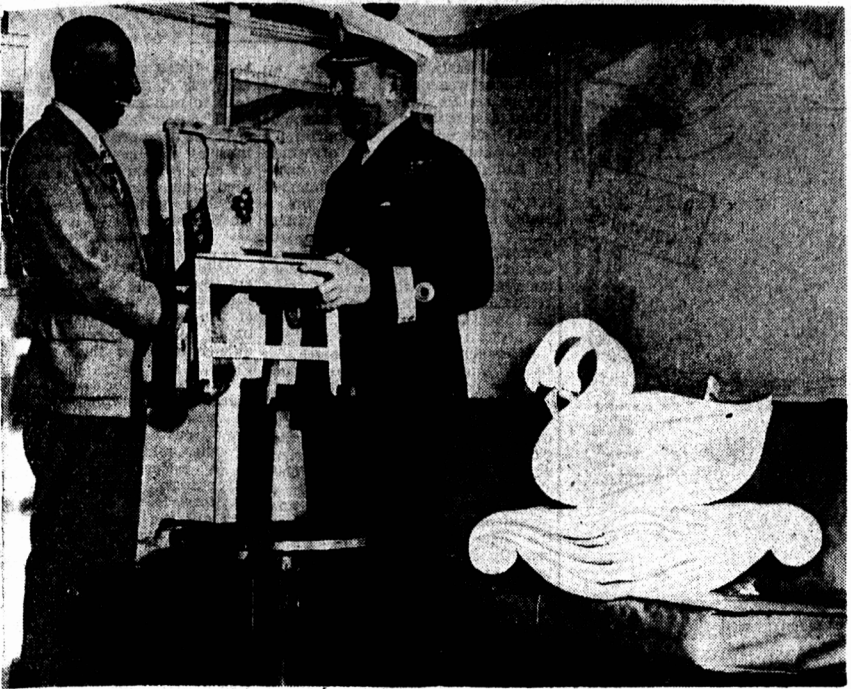

Navy Delivers The Rockers At Smith Home, St. Eleanors

Yesterday was a big day at the Nelson Smiths, St. Eleanors. The rocking chair which had been made by Mrs. Smith's father in England for their children and conveyed across the Atlantic on the aircraft carrier "Magnificent" was finally delivered in the afternoon to the Smith home by the Navy. Another chair which had been added by newsmen in Bermuda was delivered at the same time. The presentation was made by Lieut. J. M. Richards, staff officer, H.M.C.S. Queen Charlotte, Charlottetown. Needless to say there was great excitement on the part of Glen, 4, and Alan, 2, as the cases were opened. Five months old Brenda, however, looked on with great disinterest. The chair from the Old Country showed the fine workmanship of a first class craftsman as Mr. W. L. Jones of Yattoo, Somerset, England, undoubtedly is, having been chosen to carve the decoration on the Speaker's chair of the Canadian House of Commons, which was a gift from the Mother Parliament in England. It was noticed that the seat was hinged and when it was raised, reposing in the box below, were found, parcels of Christmas gifts for the family from their grandparents. The chair from Bermuda, made of Bermuda cedar by a local craftsman, was also much admired. When Mr. Jones first made the chair there was only one child in the family. Since that time he and Mrs. Jones have been trying to find a way of getting it to Canada. To send it by mail would be very expensive and it would have to be taken apart and reassembled on this side. That would likely have spoiled the fine workmanship of the article. When Mrs. Jones heard that there was a squadron of Canadian Navy ships in England this summer she wrote to Commodore K. F. Adams, captain of the Magnificent and asked him if he would take the chair across. He replied that he would be glad to and promptly Mrs. Smith delivered the chair herself to the ship. When newsmen in Bermuda heard the story they decided to get in on the show and they had another chair made and when the ship called there on her way back to Canada they sent it along as well.

Egg And Poultry Market Report

Receipts of eggs on Prince Edward Island are now increasing, reports Mr. F. M. Nash, District Inspector. Poultry Products Quality is good. Due to a very unsettled market at present, demand has slackened off but no surplus exists on dealers' floors. Station operators are quoting producers for ungraded

eggs delivered: Grade A Large 52, A Medium 48, AP & B 38, C 25. Dealers are quoting station operators for the graded pack F.O.B. station AL 58, AM 52, AP & B 42, C 29 and quoting retailers for this pack AL 58, AM 54, AP & B 44. Retail to consumer prices have not yet been adjusted to changing market. Dealers report chicken and fowl receipts lighter but turkeys, ducks and geese for the Christmas market are now coming in in greater volume. Dealers are quoting for live poultry: No. 1 Chicken over 7 lbs. 35, 6-7 lbs. 33, 5-6 lbs. 31, Fowl 5 1/2 lbs. and over 25, Dressed chicken 5 lbs. and up Grade Special 45, A 44, Dressed fowl 5 lbs. and up Grade Special 33, Grade A 32. Dealers quoting for Grade A turkeys up to 16 lbs. 56, 16-20 lbs. 49, Grade A Geese 45. Grade A ducks 42.
