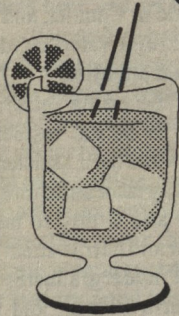

4. When hate-motivated incidents occur, and the evidence of the last few years suggests that they happen with greater frequency than we care to admit, the highest officers of the university need to exercise their full authority in condemning these attacks and correcting the underlying problems which encourage such incidents. Bias-motivated incidents are awful, but they also offer a unique opportunity for raising consciousness and for shifting the climate of opinion on campus.

These are only a few suggestions brought forward by John D'Emilio in his research on Gay and Lesbian Campus Life. There are many other studies being done as I write this article and may be explained later in the semester.

As one homosexual male told me in the past; Homosexual life on the campus does not

have any real existence. There exists many on campus who are gay but have no organization to belong to. They live their life on campus with a feeling of not belonging. He went on to say that if the role was reversed and the world had a majority of homosexuals in its population and you happened to be one of the minority of heterosexuals, and you were condemned and persecuted for being a heterosexual really denying your homosexuality, would you alter your orientation to fit the need for the so-called "moral-majority," or would you stand up for what you believed in your heart to be true?
