### Decide Deaths In Springhill Murder, Suicide

**SPRINGHILL, N.S. (CP)** A coroner's jury decided Wednesday night the Oct. 18 deaths of 13-year-old Carlotta Briggs and her great uncle, Clarence Spence, 60, were murder and suicide.  
The verdict said "We... find Carlotta Briggs came to her death from head wounds caused by a bullet from a 30-30 Winchester rifle in the hands of Clarence Spence."  
The verdict also said Clarence Spence "came to his death from head wounds caused by a bullet from a rifle in his own hands."  
Mrs. Carl Briggs found her daughter lying on the kitchen floor of her east end home shortly after breakfast last Thursday. Mr. Spence, retired coal miner, was found lying on the porch with the rifle beside him.  
A note over the signature of Mr. Spence was passed among the jurors but its contents were not disclosed.

### Expect Board Will Turn Down Move To Increase Steel Tariff

Ottawa (CP) — Ramifications of tariff board findings on Canada's steel tariff schedule reach into practically every corner of the Canadian economy. That steel is everywhere today was emphasized by the wide variety of interests that made their views known to the board during its year-long investigation of the 30-year-old tariff on imported steel.  
The men who turn out steel items for construction of all kinds had their say in the public hearings, which ended last week. So did the automotive and lumber industries, farmers' organizations and the Canadian Association of Consumers.  
About the only ones in favor of raising the tariff substantially were the Canadian basic steel producers themselves. They asked for duty increases that would amount to double the present schedule.  
With these views in mind, the board now is drawing up the report it hopes to turn over to Finance Minister Harris by the end of the year for possible legislative action at the next session of Parliament.  
It is considered unlikely that the steel producers' full wishes will be granted. It is more probable that the board will revise some items in the tariff schedule upward and others downward.  
The board heard evidence that Canada's steel makers as yet are unable to produce all the steel required by the Canadian market. The steel producers said a higher tariff would give them more incentive to expand their facilities to meet Canada's steel needs. But steel users argued higher tariffs at this time would only increase costs on items that can't be bought yet in Canada. When the steel makers asked for the higher tariff last year, they had in mind a slight recession in their industry in 1934. However, Canada's economy has since speeded up to record proportions and the steel industry is rolling along at record rates as well.

### Uphavals In Europe Leave N. Y. Stock Market Unruffled

NEW YORK (AP) — Uphavals in Poland, armed rebellion in Hungary—viewed by experts as big cracks in Moscow's world empire—left the stock market unruffled last week.  
The net result of last week's trading was pretty close to the same sluggish decline as in the previous week.  
More important to the market than international events was that big institutional investors were reported staying on the sidelines, pending a clearer outlook on what the national administration is going to be in the next four years.  
Friday's rally was attributed by brokers, in part, at least, to more confidence in President Eisenhower's re-election prospects following his Thursday night appearance at Madison Square Garden.  
The five most active stocks on the New York stock exchange were: Standard Oil New Jersey up 1/4 at 55 1/2 on 108,600 shares; General Motors, up 1/8 at 46 7/8; American Telephone, off 1/4 at 168 1/2; U.S. Steel up 1/2 at 68 1/2; and Avco, up 1/4 at 6 1/2.  
Most Canadian issues were lower on the week's trading. Aluminum Ltd. closed at 12 3/4, a drop of 1/4. Hudson Bay Mining was off 5/4 to close at 8 3/4. International Nickel was an exception to the general trend. It closed at 128, a gain of 2 on the week.  
On the American Exchange, Brazilian Traction closed at 7 1/2. Unchanged from the previous week. Molybdenum of Canada was 1/4 lower at 1 1/2. Preston East Dome closed unchanged at 6 1/4.

### Senator Davies May Bring TV To Wales

Another Canadian, Senator W. Rupert Davies, has organized a strong application for the commercial television contract in Wales, Roy Thomson who is in partnership with Senator Davies in the ownership of CKWS-TV Kingston and CHEX-TV Peterborough has obtained the contract for Scotland in the name of Scottish Television Limited. The Davies' group includes Lord Aberdare, the Welsh peer who is a former I.T.A. (Independent Television Authority) member and Tom Arnold, the producer of many famous theatrical programs and owner of a group of amusement centres, Edward Hulton, Chairman of Hulton Press Limited, London; Honourable Davies, Welsh industrialist; Claude Morris, Parliamentary Labour committee member, are the others associated with the Davies' application.  
There are several other applicants including one being advanced by the News of the World as well as Lord Darby and the British R.C.A. organization. Still another group is headed by Sir Godfrey Llewellyn, chairman of the Welsh Conservative party.  
The I.T.A. which hears applications and issues the contracts will consider the Welsh applications at any early date. The transmitter will be located near Cardiff. Senator Davies plans to build studios in both Cardiff and Bristol.

### Unusual Sight In Heavens Now

NEW YORK (AP)—The close proximity of the planets Jupiter and Venus—plus ideal atmospheric conditions—produced an eye-catching sight in the heavens early Thursday.  
"It caused quite a lot of excitement," said Jim Pickering, assistant astronomer at the Hayden Planetarium.  
As a matter of fact, Pickering said, the celestial show is going to get better the next few days. Venus will pass close to Jupiter—as far as the eye is concerned—and on Oct. 30 the two planets and the crest of the old moon will form a small triangle.  
This, Pickering said, is quite a rare occurrence.
