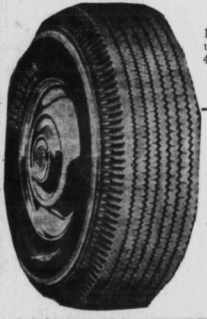

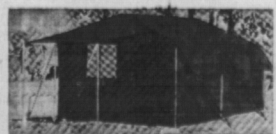

Insurance Firm Wins Court Case

PORTLAND, Me. (AP)—The Maine Supreme Court has upheld a finding that an insurance company isn't liable for a \$20,000 award to Evelyn L. Savage of Gorham in an automobile accident suit against Margaret MacKenzie of Moncton, N.B.

Miss Savage was injured in 1954 when a car driven by Miss MacKenzie and owned by Idella and Edward Jensen of Westbrook, Me., hit a tree. She won a judgment in Superior Court and then filed to obtain the money from American Mutual Liability Insurance Company, which insured the Jensen's liability.

Testimony showed that Miss MacKenzie used the Jensen's car for a longer time and a different purpose than authorized. The insurance company contended that hence it was exempt from liability.

Agreeing with Justice Walter M. Tapley Jr., who found for the insurance company, the Supreme Court said:

"In these days when reduced premiums are being offered to those who maintain a low level of accident liability, the ability of an insured to impose effective restrictions on permitted use by another becomes important not to the insured as well as the insurer."

The decision leaves Miss MacKenzie liable for the jury award.

Bowater Plans Logging Project For Labrador

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—The officials of Bowater's Newfoundland Pulp and Paper Mills left the west coast city of Corner Brook Tuesday to lay the groundwork for logging operations in Labrador.

Albert Martin, Bowater's vice-president and general manager, said the company's main task this year is to open roads to the timber stands from the company depot near Port Hope Simpson. However, he hoped the company would be able to ship one or two cargoes of pulpwood before the present season ends.

Bowater has signed a long-term lease with the Newfoundland government under which it must cut an average of at least 20,000 cords of Labrador wood a year after the first three years.

Mr. Martin said Bowater's has already secured a market for the pulpwood in France. About 70 men are to be employed this year in the initial project.

Bowater plans to cut pulpwood in Labrador in place of a number of cutting sites in Newfoundland to allow the government to encourage development of a third mill in the province. Bowater's Canada and the Anglo-Newfoundland Development Company Limited of Grand Falls are the two existing mills.

Animal Bodies From Balloon Sent To Calif.

EDMONTON (CP)—Instruments and the bodies of six dead animals transported north from halfway across North America by a high-flying balloon were flown out of Edmonton Tuesday on their way to Moffat Field, Calif.

Three research capsules in which the animals were were flown from Goose Bay, Labrador, were returned to Goose Bay.

The capsules travelled west from Goose Bay at altitudes of up to 120,000 feet for 44 hours and were cut loose from their balloon 60 miles northeast of Prince Albert.

A light plane landed on a lake near where the capsules were and flew them to Edmonton Monday.

Equipment in the capsules was used to record the reactions of two meerkats, four hamsters and a number of flower beetles to high altitude exposure to cosmic rays.

Dr. Webb Haymaker, head of the National Aeromedical Research Administration team that followed the balloon across Canada in a light plane, said the monkey and hamsters were dead when the capsules were cut loose.

Cause of the deaths was not known.

Further high-altitude balloon flights over Canada are planned in the near future by NASA.

Dr. Haymaker said the experiment was 90 per cent successful.

SONGWRITER DIES

NEW YORK (AP)—Roger Wolfe Kahn, 34, who composed such songs as "Crazy Rhythm," "Nobody Loves Me But My Imaginations," and "Somebody Loves Me," died Tuesday. Arthur Shaw and Tommy Dorsey also performed his songs in recent years. His interest in aviation overshadowed his love of music. He was a pilot and was director of service and production support at Gowanus Army Airfield during the war. He was a member of the Long Island City Air Club.
