## IN MEMORIAM

**EDWARD GALLANT**  
On Tuesday morning, October 15th, the citizens of Howland and surrounding districts in the United States and Great Britain gathered and grieved to hear that Edward Gallant had passed away at St. Elizabeth's Hospital about 9:30 a.m. after a long illness. He was born in Howland, Ohio, on June 15th, after having received extensive gas burns while employed at Curran and Brizes Co. at St. Elizabeth's in an effort to save money on building and equipment. His suffering was intense for 2 months but during the last month all hopes were held for his recovery as he seemed so improved that God would grant him life and his death was a great shock to all.  
Eddie as he was known to all was the son of Mr. and Mrs. A. Jerome Gallant and was at the early age of 34 years.  
In 1942 he enlisted in World War II serving overseas he was severely wounded in France, spending 4 months in a hospital, returning home in early Spring of 1946.  
In September 1946 he married Ellen Gallant of Woodstock. Of this union are 4 children, Gary, Leonard, Brent and Barbara. He and his wife had 2 months.  
His kindly manner and pleasant disposition was for him many a friend.
