

Grouse Shooting On Scottish Moors Failure This Season

LONDON (Reuters)—Noblemen and their friends and paying guests trudged happily over the moors of Scotland and northern England at dawn today, searching for but seldom finding a brace or two of red grouse.

Their ancestors dubbed this day "the season" because the "500" of the year, the shy heather-eating birds have been abundant, and usually in the evening the chafing dishes in stately homes are filled with succulent roasted grouse.

But this has been a cruel season for the little birds and the heather. Hundreds of grouse lost their chance of life as extreme cold in the spring chilled their eggs.

The moors, usually gloriously glowing at this time with the purple bloom of heather, this year

British Runner Equals Record For Half-Mile

LONDON (AP)—Lanky Brian Hewson, one of Britain's three fastest world milers, equalled the world record for the half-mile Saturday in nosing out Hungary's Lajos Szentgali in a driving race.

The slim, 136-pound air force bombardier fought off a strong challenge from Szentgali, European champion, to win by a step in 48.6. The Hungarian star was clocked at 1:48.9.

Hewson equalled the record held jointly by Mal Whitfield of the United States and Denmark's Gunnar Nielsen. The 23-year-old Briton's mark won't get in the book since California's Lon Spurrier has a 1:47.5 mark up for ratification.

Celtic, too, started strong with a 4-2 win over Queen of the South.

After a tense struggle, Aberdeen, league champions, snatched victory with a second half goal against Hibernian. Turnbul failed with a penalty for the losers.

One of the biggest surprises was the comfortable home win by newly-promoted Dunfermline Athletic, who beat Clyde 4-2.

HAMILTON (CP)—Al Balding, the power-hitting pro from Toronto Credit Valley, won the Canadian Professional Golfers' Association tournament Friday with a record-breaking 204 for 34 holes. He was six under par.

Balding fired sub-par rounds in two of his three trips around the par-70 Ancaster golf and country club to beat out Murray Tucker of Toronto Rosedale by five strokes.

In third place was Gordie Brydson, veteran from Toronto Mississauga. He had a 210 total.

Balding beat the CPGA record of 205 set last year by Vancouver's Stan Leonard with rounds of 65, 67 and 72.
