A Public Hearing will be held on Thursday, October 21st, at the hour of 7.00 p.m. in the Council Chambers, City Hall, regarding the proposed Master Plan of the City of Charlottetown.
The areas where citizens have objected are as follows, as per requested changes from the present Plan—
Goodwill Avenue on East side between Brighton Road and York Lane, from single to duplex.
North River Road, Orphanage property, Institutional to allowing dwellings.
Inkerman on North River, from Institutional or Parks to single dwelling.
Rochford Street between Sydney and Richmond, west side, from multiple dwelling to Commercial or Institutional.
Grafton Street, south side, between Weymouth and Cumberland from Commercial to Institutional.
Weymouth Street, west side, between Grafton and Kent, from Commercial and Multiple to Institutional.
Kent Street, north side, between Weymouth and Edward, from Multiple to Institutional.
Cumberland Street, east side, between Grafton and Fitzroy from Commercial and Multiple to Institutional.
Cumberland Street, west side, between Kent and Fitzroy from Multiple to Institutional.
Allan Street, north side, Jordan Crescent area, from Industrial to Residential.
Edinburgh Drive, west side and Charlotte Drive, north side, from single to duplex.
Malpeque Road, south of Belvedere, commercial should be limited to 250 feet.
Malpeque Road, south of Nassau Street, commercial should be enlarged so the western boundary would be in line with the area.
Westview Drive, north side, from Institutional to single dwelling.
North River Road, west side, area be extended for multiple units.
Longworth Avenue, north side, from Curling Rink to Birchwood Street, from multiple to Commercial.
Area Queen Elizabeth, Prince Charles and St. Clair Avenue, from single to multiple dwelling.
Nassau Street, north side, between North River Road and Upper Queen Street, from single to duplex.
Nassau Street, south side, between North River Road and Trafalgar Street, from single to 4-units.
All persons filing objections are asked to be present at this meeting to present their personal views; also all property owners of the areas who have objections to changes asked for should also attend to present their views.
