six weeks' time. A financial campaign is also underway to raise \$12,000 in shares, donations and pledges. The \$23,000 building will be used for a skating rink, recreation centre and agricultural building.

6.6 Miles Was Paved In 1st Prince

In answer to a written question by Premier Arsenault (1st Prince), Highways Minister Philip Matheson said that during the 1963 calendar year 6.6 miles of new pavement was laid in First Prince, and 9.2 miles were sealed from the previous year.

On the subject of the government's regarding the paving of the road from St. Louis to Palmer Road church this summer, Mr. Matheson said the policy of the government on this project will be announced in due course.

Asked about the upgrading of the Puxivie Road, the minister said that the contract had been awarded to Edmund Arsenault at a cost of \$15,324.75.

Touching on the roads to resources, he stated that during the year 6.6 miles of roads were paved under the program, with an additional four miles being sealed from the previous year.

He further stated that under this program one mile of the road from Tignish Village to Tignish Shore qualified.

Seal Hunting Controls Are Seen As Necessity

Before any workable rules to govern seal hunting practices can be drawn up, a meeting between the many countries engaged in the industry is seen as a necessity.

Sealing off Canada's east coast is an international affair, and it is unlikely that any one country would try to make and enforce hunting regulations.

Earlier this week in Charlottetown, Fisheries Minister Leo Rossier suggested that "this year will be the last year there will be uncontrolled seal hunting."

with sealers, mostly from this province, but the meetings were mainly to discuss sealing safety and survival procedures.



One fisheries authority however, has suggested that rules would have to be set by a convention of the countries that participate in the hunt.

A team of federal department of fisheries observers is now in the seal hunt area off the Magdalen Islands, gathering information on all aspects of the hunt. It is understood that if a federal government has hopes for a convention of sealing countries, and the information gathered by the observers will be instrumental in leading to a convention.

With heavy yearly kills of young seals taking place, it is likely that one of the main interests of all countries would be methods of conservation.
