Livestock

MONTREAL, July 3 (CP)—Receipts on Montreal livestock market today were 1,555 cattle; 2,088 calves; 1,949 hogs and 1,003 sheep and lambs. Hogs were firmer and other classes of live stock easier. There was about 10 percent increase in the number of cattle offered, including a very large percentage of good steers. There were not enough early sales to establish prices. Cows showed an increase of about 25 per cent in the numbers. Prices were about steady on the best and 25 cents or more lower for the commoner kinds. Veals and drinkers ranged from \$5 to \$7.50 with a top of \$8, good veals making \$7 up. Medium kinds sold for \$5.75 to \$6.75. Light drinkers and grassers made from \$3.75 to \$4.50. Lambs were uneven. Prices ranged mostly from \$7.50 to \$9.50 with an odd top of \$10. Good lambs brought around \$9 to \$10. When graded bucks were cut \$1 per cwt. and culls \$2 per cwt. Sheep were quiet at \$2.50 to \$3.50 with the odd top of \$4. Hogs were strong at \$10, for bacon fed and watered. Selects drew \$1 per hog premium with the regular cuts on off grades. Cows were \$5.50 to \$6.50. Rail grades hogs sold at \$13.50 to \$13.70 cold weight.

GRAIN

WINNIPEG, July 3 (CP)—Light selling prompted by weak-ness on outside markets caused wheat futures prices to slip more than a cent in a dull session today. Winnipeg grain exchange today. Only minor support was offered and at the close quotations were 7-8-1-4 cent down, with July at 58-7-8, October 58 3-4-7-3, November 61 5-8 and December 61 3-4 cent. Cash wheat transactions uncovered a fair demand for the top northern grades from shippers and exporters. Mills and export houses were credited with small purchases of oats and barley in the coarse grain pit. Lack of demand for Argentine wheat from United Kingdom millers and consistent liquidation in the July contract forced Liverpool 1-8-7-8d lower. Chicago slipped about a cent while Buenos Aires showed little change. CHICAGO, July 3 (AP)—Wheat prices fell about two cents a bushel today to around the low-est levels in more than two months. Heavy marketing of new wheat, with harvesting in the southwest near its peak, sharply expanding domestic supplies and weakness in foreign markets were factors that contributed to the selling. Wheat closed 1-2-1-7-8 cents lower than Saturday, July 68 1-4-1-8, September 69 5-8-1-2, corn 1-4-5-8 down, July 46 1-2-1-2, September 48 1-2-5-8; oats 1-2-1 cent lower.

MONTREAL, July 3 (CP)—Egg, butter and cheese offerings held main steady on open produce markets here today but weakness developed in potato prices, the Dominion Department of Agriculture reported. Creamery butter prints to retailers sold for 22 3-4-23 cents a pound and solids for 22 1-2-2-2. Western butter delivered in Montreal was unquoted. Quebec No. 1 pasteurized in wholesale jobbing lots made 22 1-8. Ontario white cheese was quoted at 13 cents per lb. Quebec white was quoted at 12 3-8 and colored at 12 1-2. Graded egg shipments in use free cases were offered at 25 1-2-26 cents a dozen for A-large, 22 1-2-23 for A-medium, 17 1-2-18 for B-large, 15-15 1-2 for C. Potatoes: N. B. and Maine No. 1 mts 80's 1.30-1.35; P. E. I. No. 1 mts 90's 1.50; Virginia barrels No. 1 3.50-4.00; Virginia barrels No. 1 "B" 2.75-3.00; Virginia bags No. 1 1.10-1.15-1.75; Quebec new crop 75's 2.25-2.35. French francs were narrowly lower at 2.65 5-8. NEW YORK, July 3 (AP)—Foreign exchange dealings were light today as bankers awaited fresh news from mid-Europe, traders also were inclined to take things easy pending further clues to United States congressional action on legislation affecting currency. Sterling was unchanged at 4.68 1-8 in terms of United States funds. Slight advances were chalked up for the belga, and the Swiss franc while the guilder was unchanged. The French franc picked up 1-16 point to 2.64 7-8 and the Canadian dollar 1-32 cent to 19.64 per cent discount. 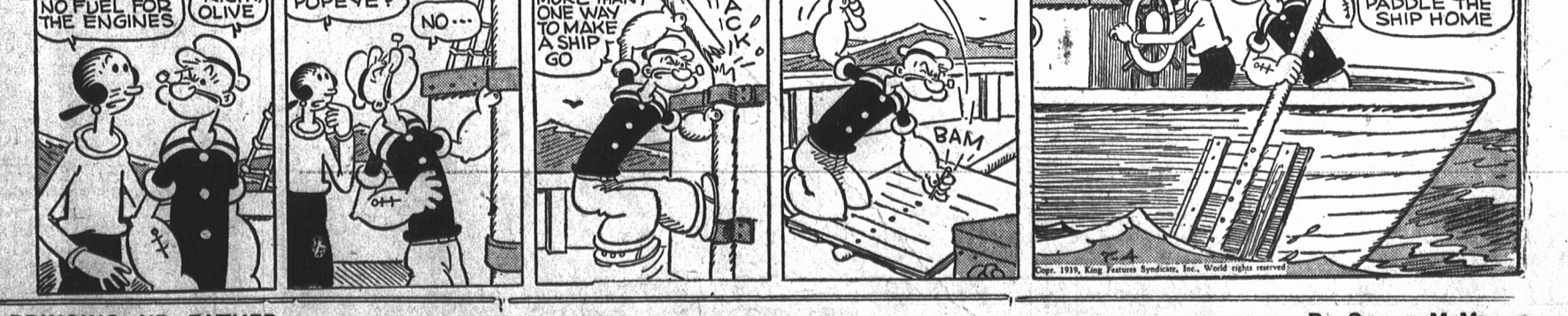
