

New Feeling Of Hope Seen In Cuban Exiles

WASHINGTON (AP) — Many Cuban exiles who once dreamed of toppling Fidel Castro by invading their homeland now say it is Castro's own military that will turn on and destroy him.

There seems to be a new feeling of hope among Cuban exiles in Washington, Miami, New York and elsewhere.

"Algo se esta cocinando en Cuba," they say—Something is cooking in Cuba.

Castro was hailed as a conquering hero when his revolution swept him into power in January, 1959, but now grumbling is audible at times when he makes his three-hour speeches.

The bearded Communist mentions with increasing frequency and bitterness the problem of guerrillas inside Cuba. And he insists they have been stamped out.

Another problem to which he refers obliquely at times is that of the loyalty of his army and

militia forces. Experts here say dissatisfaction has increased enormously within these forces in recent months with the spread of discontent among Cubans at their plight under Communist masters.

STILL IN CONTROL
Castro still controls Cuba. His military forces are the most powerful in all Latin America. The great hope of the exiles is that this power will be turned on the Castro government.

Some exiles insist there have been at least three attempts in recent months to assassinate the Cuban premier. U.S. officials say they have nothing to confirm such reports.

Exiles and U.S. officials often have disagreed about some aspects of the situation inside Cuba. Cuban refugees concede they may be influenced at times by wishful thinking, but say U.S. intelligence in Cuba has been deficient at times—as in the missile crisis of 1962.

But there are a number of things on which U.S. experts and the Cuban exiles agree:—Cuba's economy and international finance is in chaos.—Castro's theory that below-cost prices for Cuba's bumper sugar crop will be offset by profits in other production is nonsense.—The Cuban army and people's militia is heavily infiltrated by anti-Castro forces. There have been numerous purges and arrests of military men and weapons have been taken away from various units.—Hatred for the Communist regime is spreading among the populace.—Imprisonment, firing-squad executions and other measures aimed at stamping out dissenters are producing additional defections throughout all elements of the population.—Grumbling against rationing, shortages and repressive measures is widespread. One report says that when Castro told people in the vicinity of Nueva, a key port city on Cuba's north coast, that they were better off than ever before, the crowd chorused denials so vehemently they drowned out the loudspeakers. The next day army men moved into the town, confiscated dozens of businesses, dragged off dozens of prisoners.—ENEMIES EVERYWHERE
Despite Castro's claims, it is prudent to assume he has not eliminated all anti-government guerrilla groups. These are not large in numbers, but their activities are restricted by fear of repressive measures, but they operate all over Cuba except perhaps in Havana itself.

Exiles say guerrilla forces are operating now in at least seven areas of Cuba and that the Castro government knows they are there.

Castro, an unruly figure in the Communist world, is caught up in the struggle between Moscow—which props up Cuba's security, economy and military might at an estimated cost of \$1,000,000 a day—and Peking, whose more belligerent ideology Castro prefers.

There have been increasing signs that Nikita Khrushchev's successors in the Kremlin, with problems of their own, are impatient with Castro.

So far, there have been no signs of co-ordination in anti-Castro guerrilla activities, in strategic sabotage or in plans for any general uprising against the Havana regime.

KEEPS PRESSURE HOT
U.S. policy, meanwhile, remains the same: Economic, moral and diplomatic pressure on Cuba, but no permission for exiles to launch their raids from U.S. soil.

Senator Thomas J. Dodd, (Dem. Conn.), long a close observer of Cuban affairs, says

"there is today in Cuba a state of disenchantment and open rebellion against the Castro regime that bears a striking similarity to the situation that existed in Hungary before the great popular revolution of October, 1956." Soviet troops crushed the Hungarian revolt.

Dodd says the United States "must embark on a crash program to help Cuban people liberate themselves."

DETECTIVE'S BED STOLEN

LONDON (CP) — Detective Joseph Callaghan took a personal interest in the strange case of the missing bed. The bed is his.

The Scotland Yard man had ordered the custom-made bed for the home he will move into after his wedding this coming Saturday.

Callaghan can't sleep in just any bed. He is six feet three inches tall. Britain's standard bed is six feet two inches.

A bedding manufacturer promised the detective his bed would be ready when he returned to London from his honeymoon Oct. 9.

However, thieves struck at the bedding company — and stole the detective's bed. Nothing else was taken.

Cattle Prices Are Expected To Remain Firm

OTTAWA (CP)—Feeder and slaughter cattle prices in Canada and the United States are expected to remain firm for the balance of 1965, the agriculture department reports.

The late-year seasonal drop is expected to be "somewhat smaller" than the last few years.

Last June 1, the Canadian cattle population totalled 13,000,000, a 1.4-per-cent increase from the previous year.

Slaughter and feeder cattle exports to the U.S. are ahead of last year's pace and are expected to continue at the higher level, the department said.
