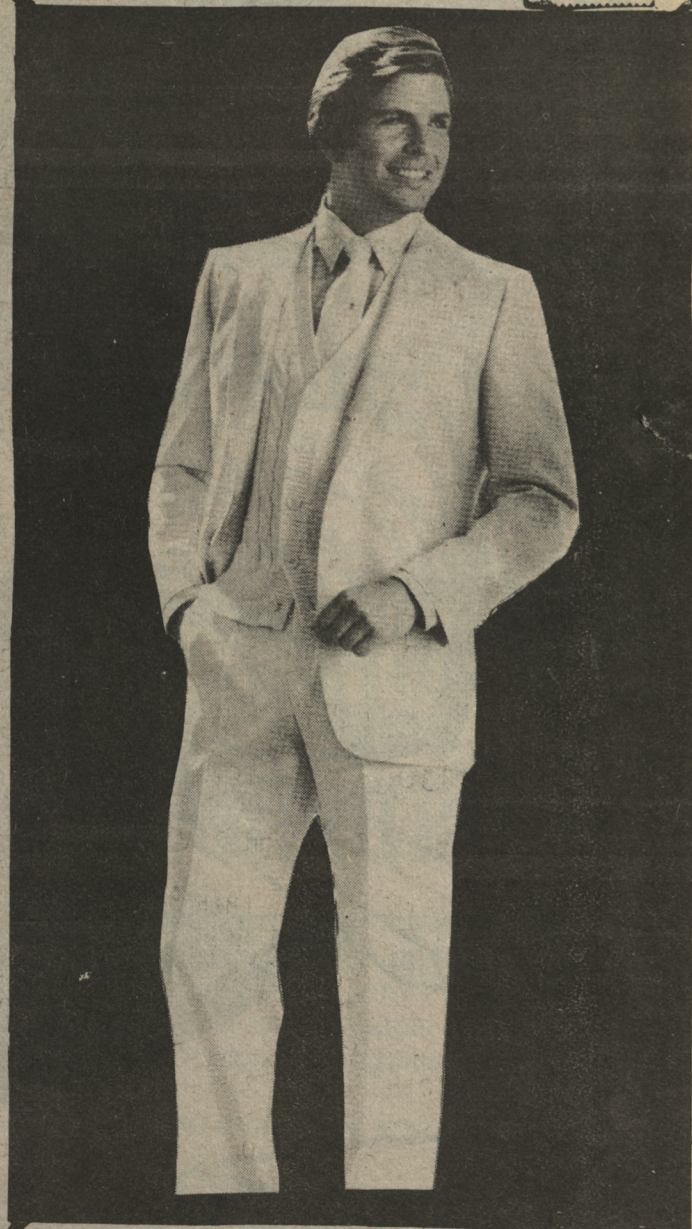
## Tony's Okay!!
