Apple-Raisin Oatmeal Is Special Breakfast Treat

By IDA BAILEY ALLEN—Barley is one of the oldest cereal grains, used for centuries in soups and entrees because it complements meat and fish, and contributes substantiality of texture and rich flavor lacking in some other grains.

PARTLY PRE-COOKED
The new quick-cooking barley has these characteristics; the reason it cooks 2-3 more quickly than old-fashioned barley is because in processing, it is partly pre-cooked. This quick-cooking barley is climbing fast to social acceptance.

"I particularly favor barley as a change from potato," remarked the Chef. "One of the entree accompaniments most enjoyed at your dinner parties is Barley Balls."

Barley Balls: To 3 c. boiling water stir in 1 c. quick-cooking barley and 2½ tsp. chicken broth powder. Boil gently about 25 min. or until barley is tender and liquid absorbed.

Stir in ¼ c. small raisins lightly sautéed with 3 tsp. chopped nut meats in 3 tsp. butter. Shape

into balls with round tablespoon or ice cream scoop first dipped in hot water.

Use Barley Balls as a garnish and accompaniment to sliced Roast Duck, Lamb à la Mode or Brown Chicken Fricassee.

Meatime, in 2 tsp. bacon or ham drippings, slow-sauté ¼ c. each minced celery and carrot, and 2 tsp. small-chopped onion. When limp, add to cooking barley and continue to cook until vegetables are tender.

Meatime rub 1 c. canned cream-style corn through coarse sieve. Stir into soup. Simmer 5 min.

Add 1 c. light cream or undiluted evaporated milk. Serve very hot. Accompany with toasted rolls.

Hot Potato-Celeriac-Egg Salad: In following order combine 3 c. hot sliced boiled potato, 1 c. hot sliced celeriac, 3 tsp. minced onion, ½ c. minced green pepper, 1 tsp. minced parsley, ¼ tsp. salt, ½ tsp. paprika, 1-3 c. salad oil, 3 tsp. vinegar diluted with ¼ tsp. water, and 2 with ¼ tsp. water, and 2 chopped hard-cooked eggs.

Stir lightly with fork until blended. Chill.

Arrange in bowl frilled with lettuce leaves.

Garnish with cooked salad dressing 2 sliced hard-cooked eggs and strips of green pepper. Refrigerate at least 1 hr.

For new texture and flavor add ¼ c. cooked barley when butter-scrambling 6 eggs. Garnish with minced parsley.
