

Notes Big Increase In Car Traffic At Borden

Figures compiled by Hon. George MacKay, minister without portfolio for the Fourth District of Prince, show that the number of motor vehicles ferried between the ports of Tormentine and Borden during the month of February 1955 was 3,401, compared to 2,490 for the same month in 1954—an increase of 1,011 and that the revenue from this source for the comparative periods were \$10,591 to \$7,326—an increase of \$3,265. Mr. MacKay was speaking to a resolution brought in by the committee on Transportation in the Legislature last week. Further information compiled by Mr. MacKay indicated that for the first days of March in this year the revenue for ferrying motor vehicles, including trucks had increased from \$819 to \$1,000 for the corresponding five days of last year, or a daily increase in revenue of \$236.47. Comparative figures for the month of February 1955 showed that only \$48 was collected for ferrying motor vehicles.
