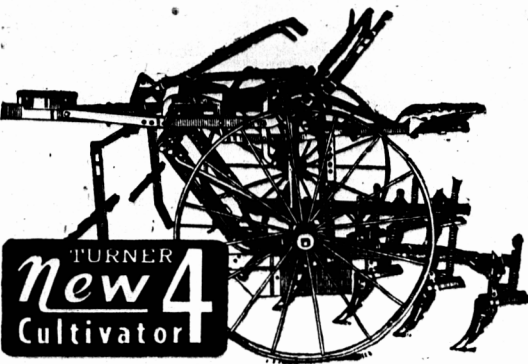

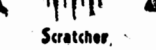
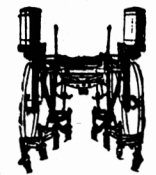


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Darnley and Vicinity

Anniversary Of Church Union Observed At O'Leary Charge

—On Sunday, June 11th, the 25th anniversary of the consummation of Church Union on June 10th, 1925 was fittingly celebrated on the O'Leary pastoral charge of the United Church of Canada. The morning service was in Bloomfield and the first afternoon service was in West Devon from 2 to 3:30 p.m. and the second afternoon service was in Brae and the evening worship was in O'Leary. There were large congregations at all places and the special message was brought by the minister, Rev. W. G. Dickson who spoke about the achievements and successes of the first twenty-five years of Union, also some of the disappointments and failures, and also a challenge for the future; new heights to climb; new goals to reach; new souls to save, etc. The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was given at all places but West Devon where it will be given on June 18th. The choirs had special music and there were pretty flowers in the Churches. A message of congratulations from the local Anglican Parish of Alberton-O'Leary and their Rector, Rev. J. R. McMahon, was read by the Minister to his four congregations, expressing the prayer that God would continue to bless the work of the United Church of Canada.

On that historic occasion, June 10th, 1925 in Toronto, when over 10,000 delegates from the uniting Churches, Presbyterian, Methodist and Congregational gathered to form "The United Church of Canada", the O'Leary charge was represented by Mr. A. J. Matheson of P.E.I. and in the Maritime Conference, Mr. Matheson is Superintendent of the O'Leary Sunday School of over 100 students for the past half a century and is still giving outstanding leadership in that responsible position. He is the proprietor of the Rex-all Drug Store in O'Leary.

Mr. Matheson accompanied by Mrs. Matheson and Rev. W. G. and Mrs. Dickson will represent the O'Leary Pastoral Charge at the Maritime Conference meeting in Sackville, N. B. on June 13th where special emphasis will be given to the 25th Anniversary of Church Union.

Brae, O'Leary and Bloomfield were former Presbyterian Churches and the Minister at the time of Union was Rev. George Tatler, now deceased. West Devon was a former Methodist Church and the
