Signs Contract For Space In Canada House

NEW YORK (CP)—The Canadian government has signed a long-term contract for space in Canada House, a Fifth Avenue skyscraper now being completed, as announced Tuesday.

The offices, on the eighth and ninth floors of the 26-story building at Fifth Avenue and 54th Street, will house the Canadian Consulate-General and the National Film Board, the announcement said. A street-level office will be occupied by the Canadian Travel Bureau.

The announcement as made by Cashman and Wakefield, Incorporated, real estate agents for the building.

The firm said several Canadian companies with the New York offices are expected to sign leases shortly.

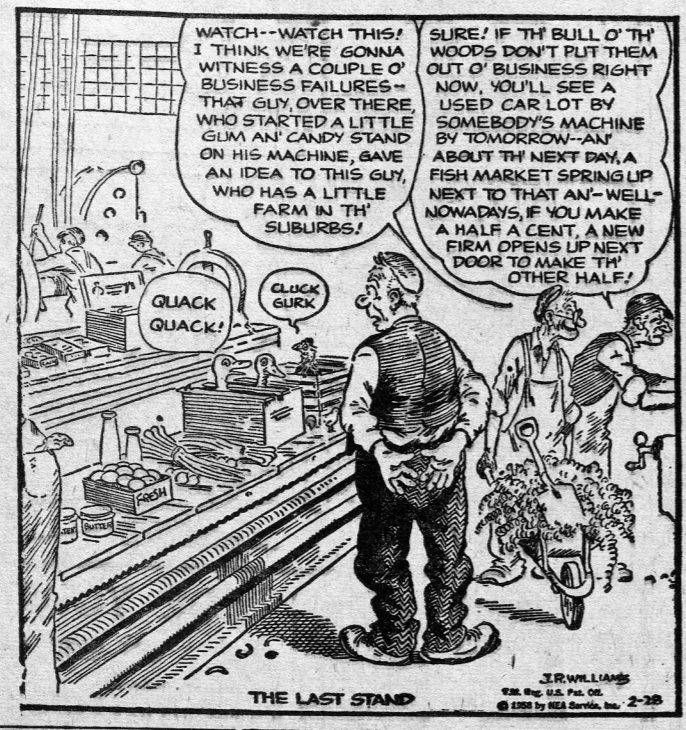

MONCTON (CP)—A former clerk and treasurer of the nearby town of Dieppe, Arthur Goguen, appeared in police court here Tuesday for preliminary hearing of a charge of theft of \$16,901 from the town.

Chartered accountant Randolph LeBlanc testified he found discrepancies and shortages in the town books. LeBlanc was the first witness.

Goguen was charged on information of Dieppe mayor Regis LeBlanc with taking the money between Jan. 1, 1952 and Sept. 30, 1957. He is free on \$4,000 bail. The hearing was adjourned to April 8.

MONTEAL (CP)—The U.S. dollar closed Thursday at a discount of 2 3/32 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, down 1-32. Pound sterling \$2.75 1/2 %.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP)—Profit-taking Thursday crushed prices in all sections as the stock market suffered its steepest decline on average of 1958.

Western oils, after a one-day climb Wednesday, were back in what has become a daily pattern for them, dropping merely two points on index.

Base metals, with International Nickel losing 1 1/2 points at 72, lost 1 1/4 points in index. Golds, the section in which profit-taking was most noticed, lost a point after a three-session climb.

Brokers said investors in several sections of the market cashed in on the profits they had accumulated recently and they termed the decline that of a technical nature.

Banks, which had been extremely strong in recent weeks, were down solidly, topped by Canadian Bank of Commerce's 1/4-point loss at 43 1/2. Some observers also thought the market was discounting Royal Bank's offer of rights to shareholders to purchase additional stock, figuring that such happens other banks might follow.

Elsewhere on the board, prices moved lower in a moderate range and most of the heavier losers were the issues which had made strong gains recently.
