Build Up Edmonton To Be Centre Of Western Defence

EDMONTON (CP)—The federal government is spending \$50,000,000 to build up the Edmonton area as a centre of defence for one-sixth of Canada's population and two-thirds of the country's area. The sum — for construction of permanent army and air force bases — is only part of a huge expenditure that will create a community of 5,000 persons just north of the Alberta capital. The army alone will pour \$8,000,000 annually into the Edmonton area for recurring expenditures only. This does not include contracts for capital expenditures on works and buildings, or stores and equipment stocked on a national basis. The air force will spend about half that amount annually.

NEARLY COMPLETION

Two miles north of the city, construction is near completion on the army's Griesbach barracks, while eight miles north, only roads and sidewalks are to be built to complete RCAF Station Namao. The first will house the army's Western Command and some of its important units — including the 2nd battalion, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry, now stationed in Calgary.

The second will be the main RCAF base in the West, under Tactical Air Command and housing 435 transport squadron, the Central Experimental Proving Establishment for cold-weather testing of airplanes, and No. 7 supply depot, stocking equipment and parts for all western air force stations.

Eventually, 2,700 service personnel will be in the area with each station providing permanent married quarters for a combined total of nearly 1,000 families.
