

Yanks Are Ready To Talk About Military Aspects Too

The arrival of the United States defence secretary, Neil McElroy, in Geneva goes a long way to rebut accusations that the U.S. is over-rigid in its approach to East-West negotiations.

Even if McElroy takes no active part in the talks, his presence implies that the American delegation is ready to talk about the military aspects of the package deal that State Secretary Herter put forward last week on

behalf of the West.

That leaves it up to the Russians to make counter-proposals to the West's disarmament plans. Up to now, Andrei Gromyko has expressed interest only in the status of Berlin and the signing of separate peace treaties with East and West Germany.

For a change, it is the Russians who appear to have been caught off balance. It is probable that Nikita Khrushchev, in his anxiety to downgrade the importance of the foreign ministers' deliberations, has not staffed Gromyko's delegation heavily with defence experts.
