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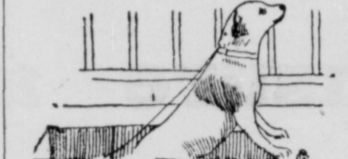
AN INTELLIGENT DOG. Carries Electric Wires Through a Culvert With Patience and Perseverance.

The method adopted by the Crompton Electric Lighting Company in laying their connections consists of copper strips (technically known as the "Strip") conducted along the whole of their system in culverts underground.

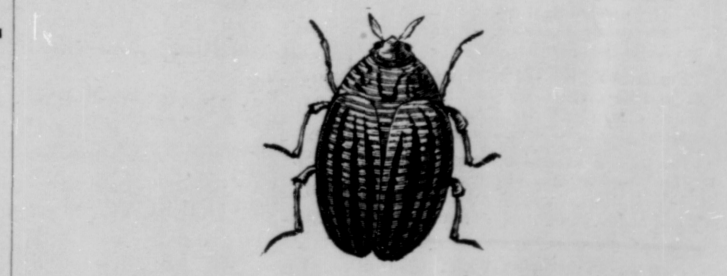
